



Sirena remained with FÅA until April 1967 when it was sold in Italy to Societá Aliscafi Sud, a subsidiary company of Aliscafi SNAV, and renamed Freccia Atlantica. As such the vessel served in Sicily for twenty-eight years, until withdrawn in 1995. CFF

THE ORIGINAL

The full scale Freccia Atlantica was delivered in May 1960 as Sirena to Finnish operator Finska Ångfartygs AB for its seasonal service between Mariehamn in the Åland island and Stockholm, Sweden. When the service finished in September, it was decided to transfer the hydrofoil to southern Scandinavia to operate between Malmo, Sweden and Copenhagen Denmark. The guest appearance in the Strait of Oresund lasted for about six.



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


